210	in tax breaks to insurance companies, drug makers and the wealthy, remove
211	millions of Americans from Medicaid, and make health insurance unaffordable for

214	We support providing sufficient services for persons with disabilities including
215	mental health plus Home and Community Based Services enabling independent
216	community living.
